

Articulation Agreement between

Borough of Manhattan Community College and Southeast Missouri State University

Associate of Science in Theatre to Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre: Musical Theatre

This document specifies the terms for a transfer agreement between Southeast Missouri State University (hereinafter referred to as "Southeast") and Borough of Manhattan Community College (hereinafter referred to as "BMCC") and is intended to benefit students at both institutions. This articulation agreement will lead to the awarding of college credit in the above mentioned programs by Southeast for courses successfully completed by students at BMCC.

This articulation agreement is intended to prepare BMCC students completing the Associate of Science degree for Southeast's BFA in Theatre: Musical Theatre program.

To ensure the BMCC student is ready to enroll in Southeast's Musical Theatre program, the student must follow the attached program of study. In addition, Southeast will accept a completed Associate of Science in Theatre as satisfying the University Studies requirement.

BMCC and Southeast will inform each other of curriculum changes that impact this agreement.

This agreement will become effective with the 2018-19 academic year.
