Students are encouraged to complete the Associate of Science Degree in Nursing (ASN) at Three Rivers College to prepare for a smooth transition to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing (BSN) at Southeast Missouri State University.

- The nursing program at Southeast Missouri State University is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
- Students can finish their BSN in as little as one year if all general education is completed at Three Rivers College

- Chemistry, Microbiology*, Anatomy & Physiology, English Composition II, and completion of all required documentation through CastleBranch as outlined in the RN-BSN Handbook http://www.semo.edu/pdf/Nursing-RN-BSN-Handbook.pdf

Students must be admitted to the nursing program prior to taking any nursing courses. You do not have to complete all general education courses prior to starting the nursing courses.

In order to meet graduation requirements, a minimum of 30 credit hours must be taken in residence (at Southeast) which could result in needing additional credit hours, 39 upper-division courses numbered at or above the 300-level are required, a passing score on the civics exam is required, and a minimum of 42 hours of general education coursework must be completed.
