KSEF 88.9 FM is On the Air!

After eight years of planning, Southeast Public Radio's expansion project in the Farmington area is on the air.

The station signed on at 50% power around Noon on Tuesday, May 16. The station is awaiting approval from the Federal Communications Commission to go to 100% power.

Initial signal reports are very good. Once at full power, it looks as though the signal from 88.9 FM will reach well into South County St. Louis.

Southeast Public Radio's Henderson Tower in Cape Removed

Southeast Missouri State University removed KRCU's 230 foot broadcast tower on campus the week of May 30th. The final piece of the tower was removed on June 1st.

The station used the tower for backup purposes only and has been broadcasting

from a tower 8 miles north of Cape Girardeau since March 2002. The tower was initially constructed in 1993 when KRCU went from 100 to 6,000 watts, thanks to a federal grant.

Folk Singer Coming to Cape Girardeau July 6



Southeast Public Radio and AT&T are proud to announce that folksinger Michael Johnathon, host of the *Woodsongs Old Time Radio Hour*, will be in Cape Girardeau on **Thursday, July 6** for the station's Folk Coffee House concert being held at Grace Café in Cape Girardeau.

Michael Johnathon is a folksinger, songwriter, concert performer, an author and has a worldwide radio audience approaching a million listeners each week. He

also created the world's first multi-camera weekly series broadcast on the Internet.

This "Woody Guthrie in a Cyber World" grew up in upstate New York along the shores of the Hudson River. At 19 years old, he moved to the Mexican border town of Laredo, Texas and found a job working as a late night DJ on KLAR-FM. One night, he played Turn, Turn, Turn by the 60's folkrock group The Byrds. As the song played, he recalled seeing folk artists like Pete Seeger and Harry Chapin performing in his Dutchess county hometown in New York.

Two months later, he bought a guitar and a banjo and settled into the isolated mountain hamlet of Mousie, Kentucky. For the next three years, he traveled up and down the hollers of the Appalachian mountains knocking on doors and enjoying the music of the mountain people.

A few years ago, Michael created his own record company, PoetMan Records USA. The first official release was his first book and CD gift set called WoodSongs. Literary reviewers have described the book series as "Walden meets Mother Earth News meets USA Today meets MAD Magazine."

Tickets are \$10.00 in advance at the Southeast Public Radio studios or \$15.00 at the door. The Southeast Public Radio studios are located at 338 North Henderson in Cape. The concert is being sponsored by AT&T.
