(Grades 7-12)**

Southeast Missouri State University offers a program in Secondary Education leading to state certification in the following areas:

Certification programs are available in Speech and Language Specialist (K-12), and Teaching Education as a Second Language (K-12).

Additionally, a Music Education major is available on the Bachelor of Music Education degree and a major in Family and Consumer Sciences Education is available on the Bachelor of Science in Family and Consumer Sciences Education degree.

A minimum grade of "C" is required in each course in the content major and in each professional education course.

In order to be admitted to the College of Education a student must:

1. have a 2.5 grade point average
2. attain 57 semester hours
3. complete English courses (ENG101 and ENG102) with a minimum grade of "C"
4. not be on disciplinary probation or have been convicted of a felony
5. have recommendation from Introduction to Classroom Teaching instructor (EDU200 if taken at St. Louis Community College)
6. meet the following testing requirements:
 - C-BASE (College Basic Academic Subjects Examination) score of 265 on all sections (including writing)
AND any ACT (American College Test) or SAT (Scholarship Aptitude Test) score:
 - OR**
 - C-BASE (College Basic Academic Subjects Examination) score less than 265 but 235 or higher on all sections
AND an ACT assessment of 22 or SAT score of 560 at or above the 66th percentile
 - OR**
 - 3.00 cumulative GPA and 235 or higher on each section of the

NOTE: Students transferring into education programs need to be aware of the need to be eligible for admission to teacher education immediately upon transfer.

Education students who completed an Associate in Arts degree or the 42-hour Missouri General Education Block will need to complete the following courses if not taken as part of the AA or general education block:

- ENG101 or ENG104
- ENG102 or ENG105
- COM101 or COM107
- BIO111, 113, 117, or 140
- PSY214 with "C" grade or higher
- HST 100, 101, 102, 103, 104 or 105
- PSC 101 or 102

Education students who are not transferring with an AA degree or general education requirements complete may choose courses from the University Studies requirements which satisfy both Southeast's requirements and state certification. The following STLCC courses will satisfy these requirements.
