### Recommended sequence of required coursework

The first year: TL525, TL648, TL585, TL601

The second year: TL620, TL630, TL530, TL625, EN686

Summer classes are available. Students are encouraged to work with their advisor to design an initial study plan that is tailored to their specific needs based on their previous experience.

#### **Degree Requirements**

The TESOL program requires practical experience before completion of the program. Candidates meet the 33-hour requirement through course work and complete one of the following capstone options:

- 1. A non-thesis graduate paper and comprehensive exam
- 2. A portfolio and comprehensive exam
- 3. A thesis and oral defense.

### **Admission Requirements**

In addition to the criteria established for general admission to graduate studies, applicants must have the following:

1. An undergraduate GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
