

An Organizing Framework for Strategic Planning Discussions

A Simple Framework

Themes Goals Domain of activity What are the 3-5 areas that you want to prioritize above all others? Requires decisions about which themes are subsumed by others (e.g. are career outcomes subordinate to student success or are they parallel) Themes implicitly communicate your values

Actions

Any Plan Requires "Buckets" to Organize Your Ideas

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Themes Goals **Actions** Intended outcomes For each theme, where does your current performance stand and where is this plan designed to take it? Fach theme must have one or more quantitative performance metrics For each metric you must agree on realistic, achievable but bold goals There are risks involved in publicly committing to highly precise goals (e.g. we will grow undergraduate non-resident headcount to X). You may instead want to publicize higher level but still quantitative goals (e.g. maintain stable enrollment in a declining market)

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Themes Goals Actions

- Steps required to achieve the goals
- What will you do differently to improve performance?
- Action must be aligned with the goals that means you need to understand why you are not currently reaching the goals and have a theory about which actions are likely to success
- Note that some actions may support more than one goal (e.g. improved pedagogy might support enrollment, student success, and career outcomes)
- Ideally you would have 3-5 "strategies" each with supporting actions

Goal	Stabilize enrollment at current levels	Increase six-year graduation rate to X	Eliminate achievement gaps between demographic groups
Actions	Grow adult/ online enrollment	Improve first year retention rate	Expand bridge programs
	Improve transfer process	Address financial barriers to retention	Redesign gateway courses
	Grow market share among resident HS applicants	Re-engage stop outs	Improve campus climate



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
